

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have issued updated guidelines on the Coronavirus - we are now at Stage 2:

1. The weekly collection will be made using baskets and will be taken after mass at the back of the church.
2. There will be no holy water in the stoops
3. Communion is of one kind only
4. The host will only be placed directly into the hand
5. Sign of peace is to be 'non-contact'
6. Coffee after Mass to be suspended
7. No hymn books, missals or Mass sheets to be handed out
8. Advice to the most vulnerable i.e. the elderly, people with weakened immune systems and long term conditions like cancer, diabetes and heart disease to refrain from large parish gatherings and stay at home.
9. Anyone with cold or flu symptoms to stay at home
10. Ensure regular cleaning of surfaces such as door handles before and after every Mass
11. When visiting parishioners at home, wash hands before giving the sacraments
12. Visitors to people in care homes or hospitals should follow advice from the staff on infection control
13. Good hygiene at Mass, i.e. thorough hand washing, is vital
