• Adult Programme:

Laudato Si Group:

Graham Hodge is leading a group of six parishioners who are meeting regularly to discuss the encyclical and implement any ideas within the Parish.

• Next programme of talks:

A Lenten programme is planned around the Creed starting in February. Peter Collins suggested that an open session should be held prior to the start of the scheduled talks to discuss Lenten practices and reconciliation. Dates and time will be published in a flyer.

• Feedback from Advent Service of Reconciliation:

The service at St. Luke's was well supported. It was a brief service and readings were delivered from the pews. The music was well chosen. There was a discussion about the examination of conscience and it was felt that there may have been too many questions and too little time to contemplate each question. Suggestions were:

Fewer questions, possibly published prior to the service

Headings could be read out, the rest printed and distributed

Reconciliation is problematic for many people and a discussion was held about ways to help those who find it difficult to participate in the sacrament. It was suggested that questions prompting examination of conscience and/or thought stimulating questions could be distributed each week during Lent.
