MESSAGE FROM FR ALBAN

Dear Parishioners,

In the past week, the TV soap opera *Eastenders* has celebrated its 40th anniversary. Many TV soaps rely on the fact that people withhold forgiveness, or determine to get even, or plot the downfall of their former lovers; it's what gives us the famous cliff-hanger at the end of each episode. Any soap opera where characters said 'Don't worry, I forgive you' would very soon run out of material. So instead, soap operas chart natural justice; people who cheat get discovered, people with nasty secrets find them made public, people who hate other people tell them to their faces. It's only fair - they had it coming.

In today's Gospel we hear the stirring words: Love your enemies

I once concelebrated at a Requiem Mass for a wonderful lady of whom it was said during the eulogy: 'she had no enemies.' At first, I thought 'how marvellous,' but subsequently I've wondered how true a statement it was – at some time or another each of us makes enemies, whether real or imaginary.

Whom would we regard as our enemies? There are people with whom we may disagree or find that they get under our skin. And we are all probably guilty of sending little wish prayers up that sound something like: "Lord, I would be most grateful if you would ring so and so's neck." Or we might wish that the Lord "would move them on" to another community or country or even another planet.

Sometimes we see enemies where none exists. Sometimes enemies can be of help to us.

Bishop Nikolai Velimirovich was a Serbian bishop in the last century who spoke out courageously against Nazism until he was arrested and taken to Dachau. He penned a thought-provoking reflection entitled 'bless my enemies,' and I'd like to conclude by sharing with you an extract:

Bless my enemies, O Lord. Even I bless them and do not curse them. Enemies have driven me into your embrace more than friends have...Just as a hunted animal finds safer shelter than an un-hunted animal does, so have I, persecuted by enemies, found the safest sanctuary, having ensconced myself beneath your tabernacle....my enemies have punished me, whenever I have hesitated to punish myself. They have tormented me, whenever I have tried to flee torments. They have scolded me, whenever I have flattered myself. They have spat upon me, whenever I have filled myself with arrogance... Whenever I have made myself wise, they have called me foolish. Whenever I have made myself mighty, they have mocked me as though I were a dwarf. Whenever I have wanted to lead people, they have shoved me into the background... Truly, enemies have cut me loose from the world and have stretched out my hands to the hem of your garment. ... Enemies have taught me to know what hardly anyone knows, that a person has no enemies in the world except him or herself.

Love your enemies - this little phrase is one of the most difficult ever uttered. It has the potential to transform our world. It's not great drama - but perhaps we've had enough drama; soap operas belong on television, not in the real world.
