MESSAGE FROM FR ALBAN

Dear Parishioners,

This year, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Our Blessed Lady has been moved to Monday, 9th December. There will be Mass in the Abbey Church on Monday at 11.30am to which all are welcome.

Confessions will be heard before Mass at St Luke's on Saturday 7th December and after Mass at St Bernadette's on Sunday 15th December. The Penitential Service for our Pastoral Area takes place on Tuesday 17th December at 7.30pm at St Joseph's, Newbury. I am also available to hear Confessions at other times. Requests should be directed to me using the parish priest's email above.

As you know, we have a new Parish Charity, the Rainbow Trust, which supports families who have children who are seriously ill. Please support our Christmas raffle by buying tickets after Mass this weekend. The raffle will be drawn next Sunday, 15th December. I wish to thank Graham and Mary Hodge, and John Williams, who have agreed to be members of the Steering Group for our parish charity. It would be good to also have parishioners to serve on this group who attend Mass at St Luke's. Please contact the Parish Office if you are willing to participate.

Over the past few months, the local news has been full of complaints about potholes in our roads damaging the wheels and tyres of our vehicles. In many places the roads are almost blocked by floods and debris.

In today's Gospel John the Baptist uses image of the road to show how we can either encourage or impede God's entrance into our lives. He proclaims "winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth." We know that it is not God's roads and paths that need to be made straight and smoothed out, but ours. In this period before Christmas the Church encourages us to prepare a way for the Lord in our hearts – to fill in those potholes created by our sins and to clear away the debris that block the Lord's path so that our hearts may be ready once again to welcome Him at Christmas.

Each Sunday during Advent we light a different candle on our Advent wreath in the sanctuary. Just as we have four candles in the Advent wreath, there are also four "rings" of Advent: Prepa-ring, clea-ring, implo-ring, and bea-ring.

Advent is the time for PREPA-RING. We tend to focus just on the external preparation for celebrating Christmas – making sure we've got the tinsel, the tree and the turkey - but what about the interior, spiritual preparation for the festivities? The best interior cleansing preparation for Christmas I know is to go to confession. It's tempting to dismiss Confession, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, as an uncomfortable and unnecessary Sacrament, probably because it is uncomfortable and easy to put off, because of so many "important" things to do. But we all have some interior road mending to do in the run up to Christmas, we all need to make that time to meet Christ in the sacrament of Confession, and receive forgiveness for the sins, even the little everyday sins of our lives. Parents particularly need to be encouraged to bring their children, once they are old enough, to receive the sacrament which is such a wonderful celebration of forgiveness, growth, and healing.

Advent is the time for CLEA-RING. It is the time for peace and reconciliation. There would never be a war in our world if somebody somewhere was prepared to say "Sorry, I'm wrong". There may be somebody in your life to whom you owe those words. Personally I find it relatively easy to say "I did wrong", because I then can go on to tell you who was responsible for making me do the wrong. (It is never me!). It requires greater honesty and maturity to be able to say "I was wrong". Before all the excitement, which can be great at this time of year we need to stop and think about "What I need to change in my life?" There are many things that we need to straighten out, especially those hills of pride and resentment that block our view of Christ who is to come. Are there any behaviours that have become self-destructive which I can leave behind? What obstacle can I remove to prepare a way for the Lord?

Advent is the time for IMPLO-RING. For praying. If we have given up giving time each day to prayer – now is the time to begin again – it needn't be a long time – a few minutes of stillness to turn to the Lord in prayer.

Finally, Advent is the time for BEA-RING. All personal preparing, clearing, and imploring will amount to nothing if they do not lead us to become better and more loving people. Our faith in God must bear fruit in concrete expressions of love, especially to the less fortunate among us. Christmas is not so much about feeling cozy and nice, or being on a spiritual high, as about becoming instruments of God's concrete love wherever we are.

Lord, give us courage in our preparing, clearing, imploring, and bearing so that this Christmas you may not be hindered from coming into our hearts and lives to bring us the peace and joy for which we long so much. Amen.
